CODE OF ETHICS

Both parties must discuss and come to an agreement on such issues as: the length of the relationship; frequency and types of meetings and other activities; how to give each other feedback; roles of the mentor and protégé.

Confidentiality is an absolute requirement for both mentor and protégé, in both personal and professional issues.

Mentoring is neither a recruitment tool for the mentor nor a job hunting opportunity for the protégé.

Both parties agree to respect each other's time regarding schedules and meeting dates.

Mentors and protégés agree to keep the mentoring activities professional. Personal relationships beyond a professional level are highly discouraged. Mentors have an obligation as a counselor to maintain an appropriate mentoring relationship.

While some mentorship relationships last a lifetime, either party may discontinue the relationship at any time.

Both mentor and protégé agree to notify the other should either party decide to terminate the relationship. Both parties agree to respect the others' wish to end the relationship.

Both mentor and protégé must provide proper acknowledgement and credit for projects worked on collaboratively.
